The **SCRAM bracelet** is an ankle bracelet that is worn by a DUI offender 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. SCRAM stands for "Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitor." The bracelet monitors the offender's alcohol consumption by sampling the offender's perspiration

**SCRAM Remote Breath** is a breathalyzer that is set up to be used at specific times of day to test alcohol levels. It has a GPS capability and photo recognition.
