The Mental Health, Alcohol & Drug Addiction Recovery Board of Putnam County is statutorily empowered to establish, to the extent resources are available, a community support system, which provides for prevention, support and rehabilitation services and opportunities. Essential elements of the system include, but are not limited to: addiction and mental health services, emergency and crisis intervention, vocational services, family consultation, etc.

Through the development of a local system of care, the Board ensures that individuals with mental health illness and/or addiction receive the services and support they need to achieve recovery.

Local Needs, Local Decision, Local Boards: As we present to the residents of Putnam County our FY 21 Annual Report. Our sincere thanks to all of our service providers and social service agencies for working collaboratively to provide a healthy and safe community for all of us.

We all faced unprecedented challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Many programs and initiatives we delayed or put on hold due to the pandemic. Local challenges that were addressed include navigating state and federal rules around telehealth, implementing a media campaign to create awareness on suicide prevention, and implementing the State Opioid Response (SOR) Grant to address the Opioid epidemic. Pathways Counseling Center used the SOR funds to create a comprehensive service program focusing on MAT, psychiatry, substance abuse prevention and community outreach.

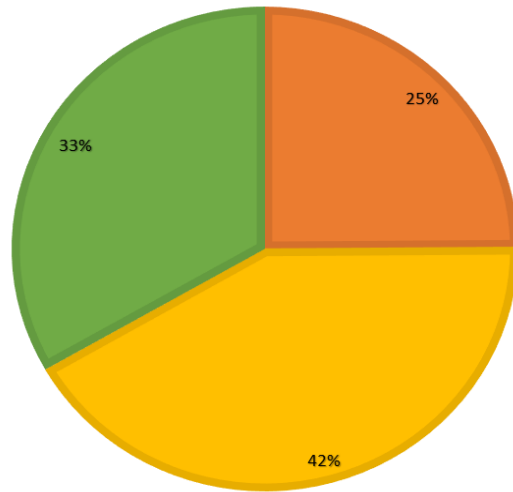
## ***Culture of Quality (COQ)***

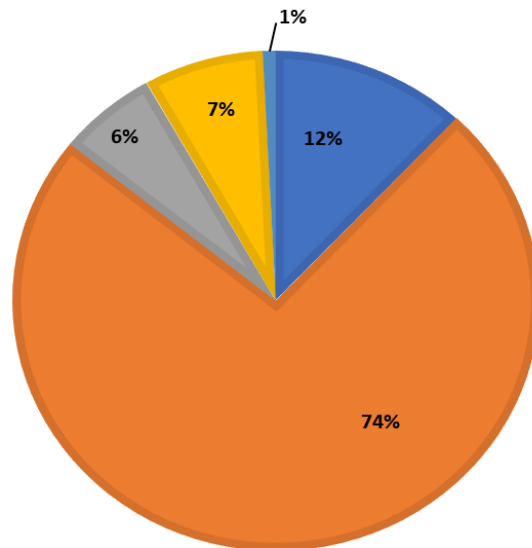

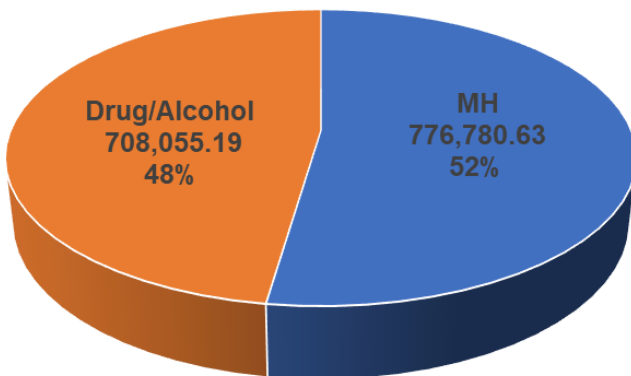
