This past year has been a year of growth for The Mental Health, Alcohol & Drug Addiction Recovery Board (ADAMHS Bd) as we work towards our mission and commitment to serve the needs of our community through our partnerships.

The ADAMHS Bd. of Putnam County is statutorily empowered to establish, to the extent resources are available, a comprehensive continuum of care. Essential elements of the system include, but are not limited to: prevention services, addiction and mental health services, emergency and crisis intervention, and detox.

The ADAMHS Bd. works with local providers, county agencies, and schools to meet the mental health and substance use needs within the county. The county has seen an increased need for behavioral health services in the last year.

In FY 2022, the ADAMHS Bd. continued to evaluate community needs through the development of a five-year strategic plan. The plan will serve as guide to our future work. Goals identified in the strategic plan include: increase the opportunity for youth to participate in prevention services, increase public awareness and support of board services, maintain a seamless system of care for consumers, and prioritize outcome driven financing to improve accountability and determine gaps in service.

Local Needs, Local Decision, Local Boards: We thank our community partners, Board members, and county residents for working collaboratively to provide a healthy and safe community.

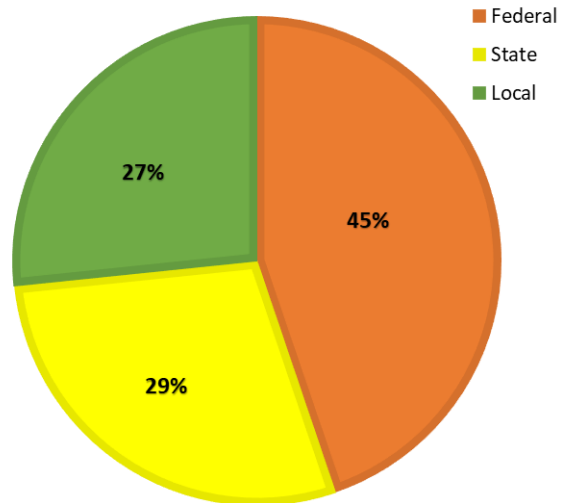
Culture of Quality (COQ)

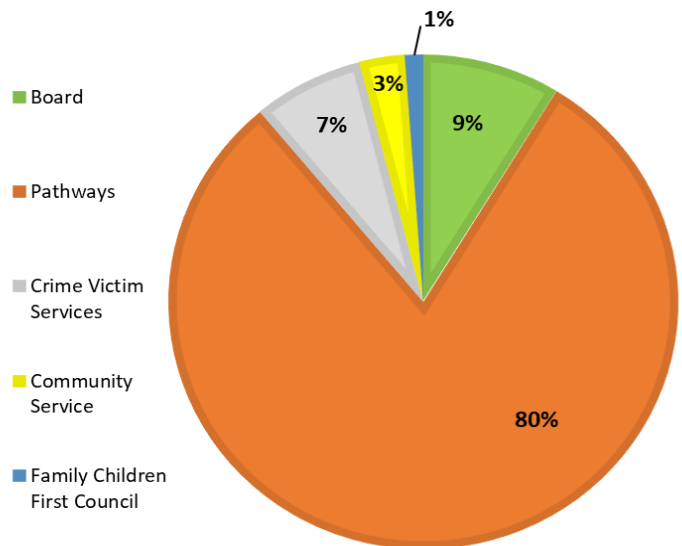

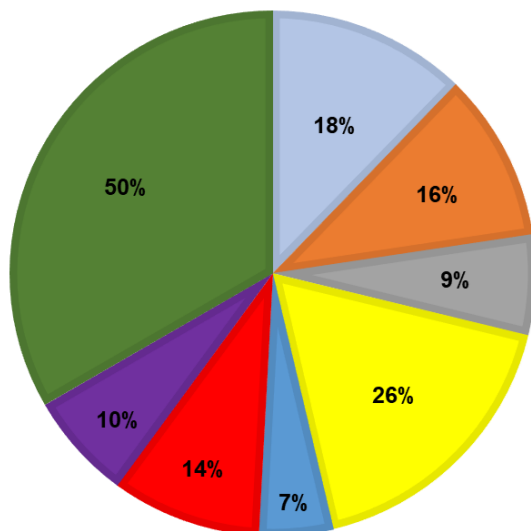
