Message to Putnam County Residents

This past year continues to be a year of growth for The Mental Health, Alcohol & Drug Addiction Recovery Board (ADAMHS Bd) as we work towards our mission and commitment to serve the needs of our community through our partnerships.

The ADAMHS Bd. of Putnam County is statutorily empowered to establish, to the extent resources are available, a comprehensive continuum of care. Essential elements of the system include, but are not limited to: prevention services, addiction and mental health services, emergency and crisis intervention, and detox.

In Fiscal Year 2023, the Community Assessment and Plan (CAP) required by the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services was completed. The CAP includes a 3 year plan for a continuum of care using data to drive services and look at the counties disparities in order to fill service gaps. The ADAMHS Bd. works with local providers, county agencies, and schools to meet the needs identified in the CAP.

In order to fulfill data collection requirements for the ADAMHS Bd, a contract with ASCEND was created to expand access to provider and partner data. The information will be used to look at who needs treatment and did the individual receive the appropriate treatment and support. The data will allow the ADAMHS Board to deepen its awareness of community needs and share the information with the community to develop programs.

Local Needs, Local Decision, Local Boards: We thank our community partners, Board members, and county residents for working collaboratively to provide a healthy and safe community.

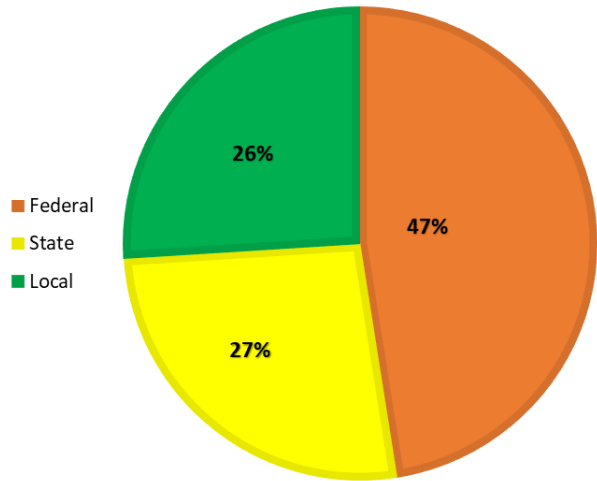
Culture of Quality (COQ)

Revenue and Expense Report FY 23

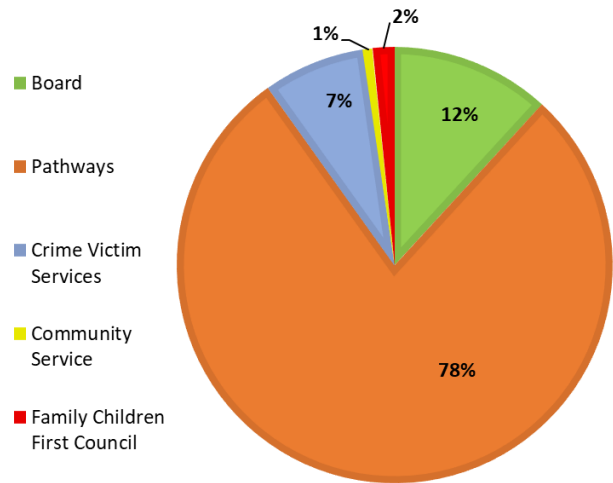

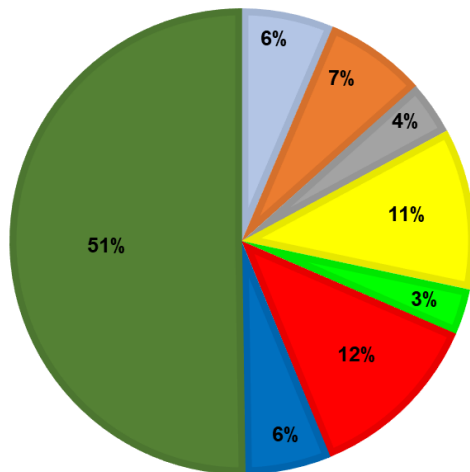
